# A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear CityHive community,

As a small, fairly young organization, every year in CityHive's history has been an immense year of growth in a multitude of ways. 2022, however, marked the biggest yet in CityHive's growth - in the most traditional sense of the word and in so many different ways - and we have so many amazing accomplishments to celebrate. What an incredible year it has been.

We started the year with our small but mighty full-time team of three, supported by a few part-time communications and program staff. As we close out 2022, we have an amazing team of seven full-time staff, supported by a huge team of part-time staff, contractors, and volunteers. Each of these new team members brings with them years of lived and professional expertise, and they are pushing our organization to think differently, tackle new challenges, and serve our community more meaningfully. Each team meeting, I feel an overwhelming sense of pride and admiration for our incredible, still all-youth team.

Last year, if you'll recall (see our <u>2021 impact report</u>), we went through thorough processes both internally and with our community to understand our impact and clarify our intended impact and strategies. This year was about bringing that to life and acting on our vision. It has been incredible to have programs that were figments of our imagination in the early days of CityHive, now brought to life.

With each new team member, we have expanded our capacity to deliver new and better programs. 2022 marked the launch of several new programs and pilots, many of which have been in the works for years. CityShapers in Schools bring civic literacy programming to Metro Vancouver classrooms. The Youth Climate Innovation Lab builds on the learnings from three years of Envirolab programs. The Youth Civics & Climate Leadership program brings climate action workshops into community settings. All programs that we are excited to carry into 2023 and beyond.

2022 also marked the second municipal election season since our founding. We conducted a full What Youth Want campaign to solicit youth opinions on election issues and share them with candidates. We ran a Youth Elections Ambassador program across three Metro Vancouver municipalities, and we hosted two well-attended get out the vote events. In the end, low voter turnout in most municipalities merely pointed to the ever-present need for more extensive and meaningful resident engagement in between election cycles - something we are committed to doing.

When Tesicca and I co-founded CityHive, we couldn't have imagined how far the organization would go. Growing from a mighty duo, CityHive is now supported by an incredible team of 12+ staff and 7 Board of Directors. We have maintained our youth-led status since inception, and in 2022 we brought CityHive to a new era as an established organization with a much larger team and ongoing programming.

And now, after an incredible 6 years as CityHive's Co-founder and inaugural Executive Director, I will be passing the torch to a new, young leader in mid-2023.

This is an exciting time of growth and change for CityHive, and while leaving is bittersweet, I am excited to watch CityHive write its next chapter under new leadership! With new strategic clarity, supportive funders and our incredible community, there is so much momentum to carry CityHive into this next chapter. But don't worry! There will still be lots of time for goodbyes in 2023, and many more wins to celebrate in the years to come. I look forward to connecting with our wider community through this upcoming transition, and can't wait to see what's next for CityHive.

## We're better together.

## Practicing hybrid learning.

### **Youth Elections Ambassadors**

Voter turnout has been steadily decreasing over the past several decades, and with that, so has young engagement in elections. In response, the 2022 Youth Election Ambassadors set out to engage their communities of local youth in municipal politics and the elections! In partnership with the City of New Westminster, the City of Vancouver, and the District of West Vancouver, CityHive worked with a group of 10 youth to equip them with the knowledge, resources, and connections they needed to build stronger relationships between youth and their municipal governments, in an effort to build trust and get out the youth vote.
